→ Concept

Risk Assessment

Conducting a risk assessment is the logical first step in public transport security. In the context of a European funded project called COUNTERACT, led by UITP, a set of guidelines for conducting risk assessment was developed to meet the specific needs of public transport companies. Participants will learn how to conduct a Security Risk Assessment: in groups, a fictive public transport network is assessed under the guidance of experienced experts.

Emergency Preparedness & Response

If you can't avoid it, how can you handle it? Starting from the same fictive network, and following a predefined scenario, the participants will respond to a serious security incident in the form of a table-top exercise. In groups, and under the guidance of experienced experts, the scenario will unfold throughout the course of the session during which the groups must discuss and decide how to react.

→ Target audience

- Security managers and officers
- Operational staff actively engaged in security management
- Top and middle management considering how to incorporate security aspects into the organisation

→ Methodology

- Based on tried & tested COUNTERACT methodology
- Interactive workshops (group work) to share experience with fellow participants
- Guidance from experts

→ Trainers

To ensure a high quality training programme, a Pool of Experts has been established from among the membership of the UITP Security Commission.

→ Language policy

Applicants must have a very good **passive knowledge of the English language**. All material will be provided and presented in **English**. However wherever possible, trainers will be chosen from the Pool of Experts to match the native languages of the registered participants in order to facilitate a maximum level of communication and participation.

- Learn the principles and benefits of conducting a security risk assessment
- Practical guidance on conducting a security risk assessment in your own network
- Experience a table-top security exercise
- Build up knowledge in preparedness & response
- Share knowledge and learn from experienced experts
