Earlier this month, UITP announced <u>President Renée Amilcar's plans to step down</u> from her role.

Due to necessary commitments to her new role as Chief Executive Officer and President of Mobilité Infra Québec, Renée must focus on her position in Québec, resulting in an earlier end to her latest two-year mandate.
